Chapter 1 <u>Institute Profile</u>

INTRODUCTION

Narula Institute of Technology is a leading autonomous Engineering & Management college, located at Agarpara near Kolkata under the aegis of JIS Group Educational Initiative since 2001.

It is approved by AICTE and affiliated to MAKAUT, formerly known as West Bengal University of Technology and has NBA accredited degree programmes in engineering. It boasts of the prestigious NIRF ranking among 150 selected institutes of India. It is also accredited by National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC). The college has also received the notable World Bank Assisted and MHRD approved TEQIP (Phase II) grant for the advancement of Technical Education. It is eligible for receiving Central assistance under the recognition of 2(f) & 12(B) under UGC Act.

The four-year B. Tech course is imparted in the streams of Computer Science Engineering, Electronics and Communication Engineering, Electrical Engineering, Civil Engineering, Information Technology, Electronics and Instrumentation Engineering and Mechanical Engineering. The institute provides a brilliant platform for pursuing higher studies through PG courses like M.Tech (CSE, ECE, EE- Power System, CE- Structural Engineering), MCA. It has expanded to include diploma programs in EE, CE and ECTC under the affiliation of West Bengal State Council of Technical Education.

The institute boasts of a powerful R & D cell with immense contribution from the scholarly faculty members. There is an enormous repository of International and National Journal publications, E- books, Online Lectures which have drawn nationwide attention. With the encouragement and support from the college, around ten projects funded by organizations like UGC, DST, BRNS and AICTE are running successfully by the faculty members till date. Very recently the ECE Department has secured the MODROBS grant for upgrading their Embedded System and Electronic Design Automation Lab.





Narula Institute of Technology offers a number of courses ranging from Engineering (B. Tech and M. Tech), and Computer Application (MCA). Diploma in Engineering in branches of Electronics and Communication Engineering (ECE), Electrical Engineering (EE). Mechanical Engineering (ME) and Civil Engineering (CE) is also taught.

Each of the courses offered have a separate Entrance Test according to their respective Government of West Bengal examination boards.

Student admission for B. Tech is through WBJEE. Whereas for M. Tech the intake is through GATE score and PGET examination. Intake for MCA is through JECA. The entrance test for Diploma courses is JEXPO.

Also as per Government norms, 10% seats are reserved for Diploma Engineering students for t admission (Lateral Entry) to B. Tech 2nd year. The admission occurs through JELET.








ICT based Classrooms


The institute has been making an untiring endeavour since its inception for ensuring adequate availability and optimal utilization of physical infrastructure for smooth conduction of teaching learning activities within a well maintained lush green campus. It has adequate infrastructure in alignment with the regulatory norms as listed below.

Classrooms for Theory/Tutorial Classes: The institute has 52 ICT-enabled ergonomically designed classrooms each with proper ventilation and reverberation free ambience for smooth conduction of theory classes. Additionally, there are also adequate numbers of tutorial rooms to cater to the special needs of teaching learning process.




Laboratory & Computing Facilities: Adhering to the specifications as laid down by the regulatory body, the institute always makes sincere endeavours to ensure quality of all of its UG and PG laboratories (including research laboratories). All the laboratories including workshops are equipped with excellent instruments. There are also some industry sponsored laboratories to offer training for Remote Sensing, PCB design and Fluid Power Control.

A constant effort has been made to modernize laboratories for upskilling students on modern-day automation in alignment with the need for Industry 4.0 digital transformation. The non- IT lab facilities encompassing Mechanical Engineering Labs (e.g. Hydraulic Lab), Electronics Engineering Labs (e.g. PLC Lab), Electrical Engineering Labs, Civil Engineering Labs, Instrumentation Engineering Labs etc. are also equipped with most modern setups procured from global technology giants such as BOSCH, Siemens, Honeywell etc.



In recent days, computer system has become an inseparable component for every academic activity. The entire campus has 980 active PCs with the latest i7/i5/i3/Core2Duo, 16GB/8GB/4GB/2GB DDR4 RAM hardware features. Sufficient number of essential licensed system software (19) and licensed application software (54) with annually renewed Microsoft campus agreement are installed in each PC. Beyond the basic software requirements of teaching and learning, the institute has also ensured availability of several utility software kits such as IBM RATIONAL ROSE, CATIA V6, DEL STATISTICA, STAAD PRO, ANSYS, CADENCE, Visual T-CAD, Symica AMS IC Design Tool Kit, Proteus VSM, Synopsys EDA Tools, Mathematica, Caspock, Matlab, LabView, MiPower etc. The institute has a central computer centre which comprises adequate number of computers with 1:3 availability ratio for the students to carry out their academic and research activities smoothly without any logistic issues. All computers are connected to the internet over high-speed cables and a dedicated system admin looks after the maintenance of the computing facility.



Internet Connectivity, G-Suite Google Account & Printer Facilities: Institute provides uninterrupted access to network services with 200 Mbps internet bandwidth. The campus is Wi-fi enabled with 24/7 internet connection facilities having adequate band-width for conducting live sessions. The institute also provides printing facilities to the faculties with availability of different types of LaserJet black & white and colour printers. Each faculty member is also officially provided a g-suite google account to avail facilities like Gmail, Google Meet, Google Classroom, Google Drive for ensuring collaborative working environment.

Additional Facilities: In addition, the institute has five digital studios which have the facility for recording and projection with audio visual system. The institute also has a dedicated language lab equipped with the most advanced AV System and ISIL software.

Examination Committee

To conduct the end semester examinations, to conduct and monitor the slot tests and to monitor the evaluation of students including continuous evaluation and internal assessment, an Examination Committee has been formed consisting of HODs of all departments and Registrar before the commencement of 20201-22 Academic Session. In addition to these members the Examination Committee has the following members.

- Controller of Examination (Convener).
- Assistant Controller of Examination
- Registrar.
- HODs of all Department

Question Papers for Semester Examinations

All paper-setting was made in three sets for each subject. One of the sets was prepared by internal faculty and other two sets were from external faculty. All moderation was done by external faculty in online mode. All paper-setting and moderation were done using dedicated computer facilities in a central control room

After moderation, Question Papers were reformatted in PDF files, and uploaded to a central server.

A summary of the question bank preparation has been given below.

All paper-setting for slot examination was done by internal faculty members for each subject. After notification of the slot test examination, internal faculties must submit the question papers within the stipulated time in a specific format. Then all these question papers are processed and arranged day-wise and time wise before the examination.

Conduct of the Semester Examinations

After moderation, Question Papers were reformatted and printed at the department of COE. After printing, question papers for each subject were stored in two Godrej Almirah with double key lock at department of COE.

On the date of each examination, specific question paper the question papers and blank answer scripts are then distributed to invigilators of specific examination halls at the department of COE. The invigilators carried the question papers, blank answer scripts and other examination material to the examination halls. A summary of the question bank preparation has been given below.

All paper-setting for slot examination was done by internal faculty members for each subject. After notification of the slot test examination internal faculties have to submit the question papers within stipulated time in specific format. Then all these question papers are processed and arranged day wise and time wise before examination.

The following examination activities were fully automated through online Examination Portal:

- Examination Form fill up by students using integrated examination portal
- Admit Card printing by students from online portal
- Internal Marks fill up by faculty
- Semester Examination Marks fill up by faculty
- Result Processing and Publication
- Grade Card and Provisional Certificate Printing

Three-step approval process is followed for examination form fill up by students.

- Step 1 Accounts approval for Semester Fee clearance
- Step 2 Head of the Department approval for class attendance in the semester
- Step 3 Accounts approval for Examination Fee payment

Evaluation and assessment

The faculties were provided online answer script, question paper with section, sub-section and number break-ups. The faculties were also provided with answer key. Marks were awarded by the faculty for each question number only. The internal marks were directly entered online by respective faculty from the logins provided to respective departments. The tabulation and result processing were automated.

After result processing, TR sheets were sent by the external agency vide email to COE and after verification consent was given for online result publication. After online publication, semester grade cards of all students were printed at department of COE from the integrated examination portal for distribution to the students.

Evaluation of Theory Papers (70 marks)

All appointment for examination of answer scripts were awarded to external faculty. The external faculty checked each answer script and entered marks awarded for each question. All evaluation was carried out by the examiners in online mode with automated tabulation facility.

Scrutiny was completely automated using the Digital Valuation System (DVS).

For distribution to Head Examiners, 10% of the answer script packets were randomly selected by the DVS and mapped to Head Examiners. All such re-evaluation was carried out by the Head Examiners in online mode with automated tabulation facility.

Internal Marks for Theory Papers (30 marks)

The internal marks were awarded by the internal faculty for the respective courses conducted by them as follows:

Average of two Slot Tests: 15 marks Assignment & Quiz: 10 marks Attendance: 5 marks

All marks were entered in the Examination Portal from the department using login IDs of faculty. A printout of all marks entered was taken out from the faculty login and submitted to the department of COE.

Evaluation of Practical / Sessional (100 marks)

For the Semester Examination of Practical / Sessional, external examiners were appointed.

In the semester examination of each laboratory practical course, the course teacher had assigned experiments to be conducted by groups of 4 or less number of students after holding a lottery. The assessment of the student performance for experiment was done in consultation with the external examiner (40 Marks). Viva-voce was conducted in presence of the external faculty and the course teacher. The assessment of student performance in viva-voce was done by each internal faculty in consultation with the external faculty (20 marks).

The course teacher had awarded the marks for student performance in laboratory classes based on the Continuous Evaluation sheets for each student (40 Marks).

For Sessional items where the formal Institutional contact hours are not specified, (viz. Online courses, Internships, Co-curricular/Extra-curricular activities etc.), or there are no formal End-semester examination of the written kind, (viz. Comprehensive Viva-voce, Seminar, Industrial Visits, etc.), an External Expert of the relevant field was appointed. For all items under these categories, assessment of student performance in viva-voce was done by the internal faculty in consultation with the external expert (100 marks).

All marks were entered in the Examination Portal from the department using login IDs of faculty. A printout of all marks entered was taken out from the faculty login and submitted to the department of COE. A summary of evaluation for theory papers has been given below.

After verification consent was given to the external agency for online result publication. After online publication, semester grade cards of all students were printed at the department of COE and distributed to the students.



Life Skills


