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NATIONAL SOCIAL SERVICE (NSS)

The National Service Scheme (NSS) was officially started in the year 1969, to establish a meaningful linkage between the campus and the community. The vision is to build the youth with the mind and spirit to serve the society and work for the uplift of our country as a movement.

- Social services are a range of public services provided by any national or regional government organization for its residents, including such things as health care, public housing, social care and social security.
- According to Web definition, it is an organized activity to improve the condition of disadvantaged people in society.
- According to Merriam Webster, „Social service is an activity designated to promote social well-being specifically organized Philanthropic assistance to disadvantaged“.

After independence the University Grants Commission, headed by S. Radhakrishnan, recommended the introduction of voluntary national service in academic institutions. This idea was again considered by the Central Advisory Board of Education (CABE) at its meeting in January,1950. Mahatma Gandhi, the Father of the Nation, had recognised that the country could not progress in a desired direction until the student youth were motivated to work for the upliftment of the villages/community. For Gandhiji, the villages, where majority of the population living, represent the country. Therefore, for the national reconstruction and national resurgence it was deemed fit that the students and teachers should be properly sensitised and utilised for strengthening the Indian society as a whole with particular emphasis on rural community. Therefore, student youth, teachers and the

community are considered as the three basic components of the National Service Scheme. After examining the idea and the experiences of other countries in this field, the board recommended that students and teachers should devote time to voluntary manual work. In 1958 Jawaharlal Nehru, in a letter to the chief ministers, considered the idea of social service as a prerequisite for graduation. It was directed the Ministry of Education to formulate a suitable scheme for the introduction of national service into academic institutions. The Education Commission (headed by D.S. Kothari from 1964–1966) recommended that students at every stage of education should be associated with some form of social service. In a government statement of national policy on education, it was stated that work experience and national service should be an integral part of education. The National Service Scheme has been functioning with the motto “NOT ME BUT YOU” in view of making the youth inspired in service of the people and hence NSS Aims Education through Community Service through Education.

Social services are a range of public services provided by any national or regional government organization for its residents, including such things as health care, public housing, social care and social security. According to Web definition, it is an organized activity to improve the condition of disadvantaged people in society. NIT, AGARPARA | APRIL 22, 2023


Objective of the Event: To raise awareness and inspire collective action towards environmental protection, sustainability, and the preservation of our planet for future generations.

Number of Participant: 104



Description of the program:


Planning and Execution:

AWARENESS PROGRAM ON TREE PLANTATION



The tremors of this devastation was felt all over the country as death tolls rose alarmingly and life came to a perpetual standstill. The disease became a household name across the country and with that came the inevitable deaths. As we come down slowly but surely from this fatal curve, our physical and mental health seem to have taken a toll. At a time of crisis such as this, Mental wellbeing is as important as physical wellbeing. After all, the mind can accomplish things we would physically not expect.

Narula Institute of Technology stood by people at the time of the Pandemic. NiT, in collaboration with Art of Living organised a Post Covid Care Workshop for the students from 20th October, 2022. The NSS Committee took the initiative to invite Ms. Priyanka Agarwal and Ms. Madhu Goyal from the Art of Living NGO to organize "the three day wellness workshop on Covid Care and Anxiety Relief" on an online platform.

The students were taught the right way to practice Yoga postures to ensure release of stress and toxins from the body and breathing exercises to ensure healthy respiratory systems and proper metabolism which are the main weapons against the deadly pandemic. After each meditative session, the benefits of meditation and how to meditate

were taught. Similarly after every asana, its benefits, its pros and cons were discussed in detail by the instructors. There is no weapon greater than the meditative mind in fighting and dealing with uncertainty, fear and hopelessness. Number of Participant: 119


Description of the program:


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


concerns. These sessions were open to students, faculty, and the local community.



Objective of the Event: To test the eyes of people.


Number of Participant: 200
