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NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS)

The National Service Scheme (NSS) was officially started in the year 1969, to establish a meaningful linkage between the campus and the community. The vision is to build the youth with the mind and spirit to serve the society and work for the uplift of our country as a movement.

- Social services are a range of public services provided by any national or regional government organization for its residents, including such things as health care, public housing, social care and social security.
- According to Web definition, it is an organized activity to improve the condition of disadvantaged people in society.
- According to Merriam Webster, „Social service is an activity designated to promote social well-being specifically organized Philanthropic assistance to disadvantaged“.

After independence the University Grants Commission, headed by S. Radhakrishnan, recommended the introduction of voluntary national service in academic institutions. This idea was again considered by the Central Advisory Board of Education (CABE) at its meeting in January, 1950. Mahatma Gandhi, the Father of the Nation, had recognised that the country could not progress in a desired direction until the student youth were motivated to work for the upliftment of the villages/community. For Gandhiji, the villages, where majority of the population living, represent the country. Therefore, for the national reconstruction and national resurgence it was deemed fit that the students and teachers should be properly sensitised and utilised for strengthening the Indian society as a whole with particular emphasis on rural community. Therefore, student youth, teachers and the community are considered as the three basic



components of the National Service Scheme. After examining the idea and the experiences of other countries in this field, the board recommended that students and teachers should devote time to voluntary manual work. In 1958 Jawaharlal Nehru, in a letter to the chief ministers, considered the idea of social service as a prerequisite for graduation. It was directed the Ministry of Education to formulate a suitable scheme for the introduction of national service into academic institutions. The Education Commission (headed by D.S. Kothari from 1964–1966) recommended that students at every stage of education should be associated with some form of social service. In a government statement of national policy on education, it was stated that work experience and national service should be an integral part of education. The National Service Scheme has been functioning with the motto “NOT ME BUT YOU” in view of making the youth inspired in service of the people and hence NSS Aims Education through Community Service through Education.

Social services are a range of public services provided by any national or regional government organization for its residents, including such things as health care, public housing, social care and social security. According to Web definition, it is an organized activity to improve the condition of disadvantaged people in society. We stay true to our mission by realigning our wide-ranging roles with five new strategic thrusts to better meet tomorrow’s social needs. 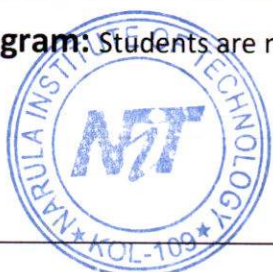


Blood camping held by students and doctors 22th april,2016

AGARPARA | MARCH 8, 2016


Objective of the Program: To promote peace with women's rights.

Description of the Program:

On the occasion of women's day Mini Marathon was organized by Narula Institute of Technology, under JIS group Educational Initiatives. The bystanders and the residents at Kamarhati witnessed a brilliant show of harmony on March 8, 2016 when around 572 participants ran gleefully in the 3.5 km. The Marathon echoed the slogan 'Run with gaiety, Pledge for Parity'. This event aimed to spread the message of Gender uniformity among the people. Besides the participants from the host institute, the schools in the neighbourhood also joined the Marathon in order to express their solidarity. The gender split was 46% females and 64% males and the participants ranged in the age group between 12 to 65 years. The participants took an oath in favour of Gender uniformity before the commencement and then with the count of ten the race was flagged off by Mr. Soumen Bose, eminent cricket coach (Cricket Association of Bengal) from Kamarhati bus stand at 4pm. The entire route was well managed by the college volunteers and the traffic control. The event was graced by the former national footballer Mr Pratap Senapati, local councillor, Principals of neighbouring schools and the dignitaries of JIS group.

WASTE MANAGEMENT AND MODEL PREPARATION

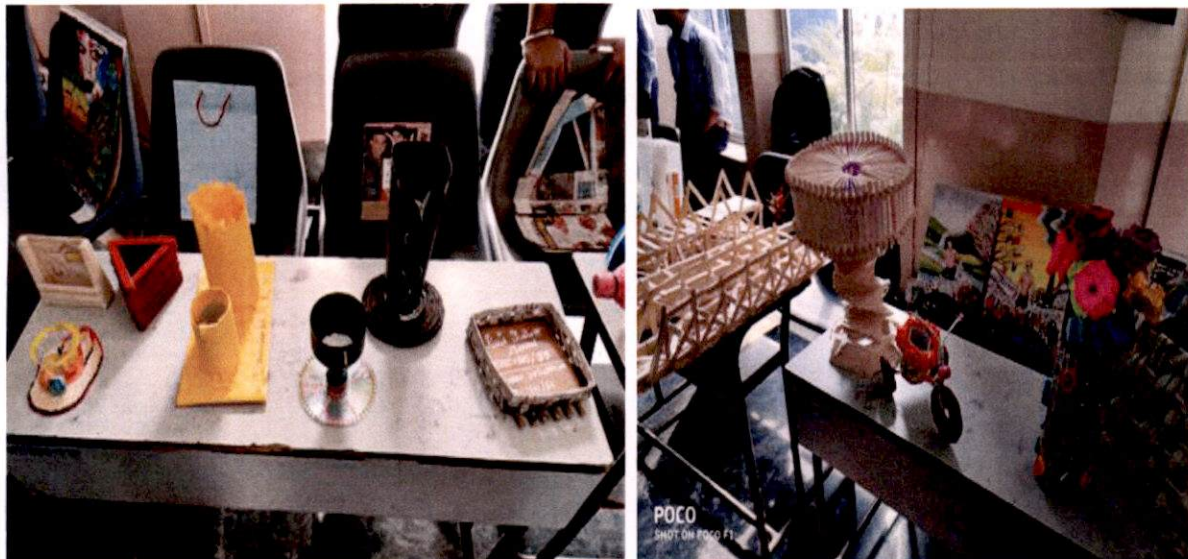

Description of the Program:

43 Students of Narula Institute of Technology took an initiative to create a 'SWINE FLU' awareness program among the school children of Shree Saraswati Vidyalaya, High School, situated at Nilgunj Road, Agarpara. Our main objective was to spread awareness among the small children of standard V, VI, VII, VIII and IX to make them understand the need of precaution against H1N1 virus. They were mainly advised to follow these precautions:

- a) To wash hands frequently with lukewarm water with soap before and after meals.
- b) To drink plenty of fluids and eat a balanced diet.
- c) To cover nose and mouth with tissue before cough and sneeze.
- d) To carry camphor and cardamom in equal quantities in their handkerchief and to sniff the mixture after every half an hour.
- e) To stay away from school if they have high fever, cough and sneeze.
- f) To maintain the health and hygiene of the school we gave them a 5litre phenyl to the school authority.

There were altogether nine students across all BTECH Streams, three faculty members from Narula Institute of Technology participating in the program. The program was highly successful as the students also interacted with us to clear their misconceptions about the deadly disease. They were highly enthusiastic and eagerly participated in our noble mission.

SLUM AREA VISIT

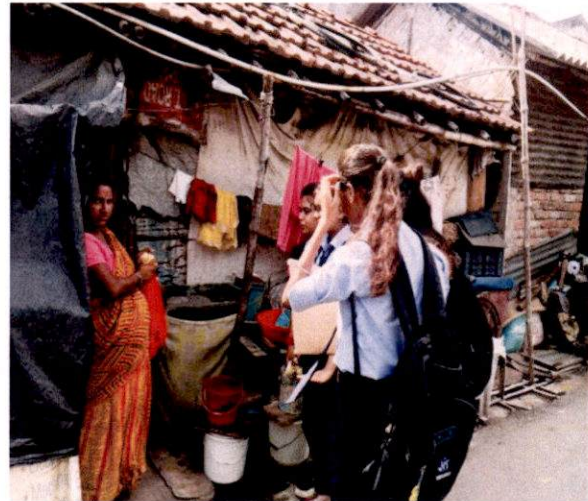
AGARPARA | SEPTEMBER 18, 2015

Objective of the Program: To spread the awareness of education among the slum people.

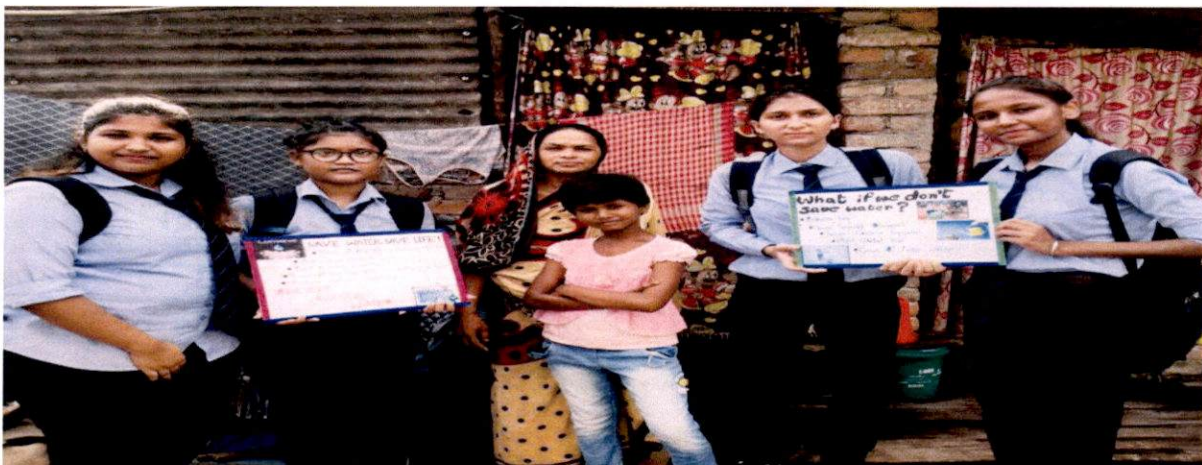
Number of Participant: 106

OLD CLOTH DISTRIBUTION

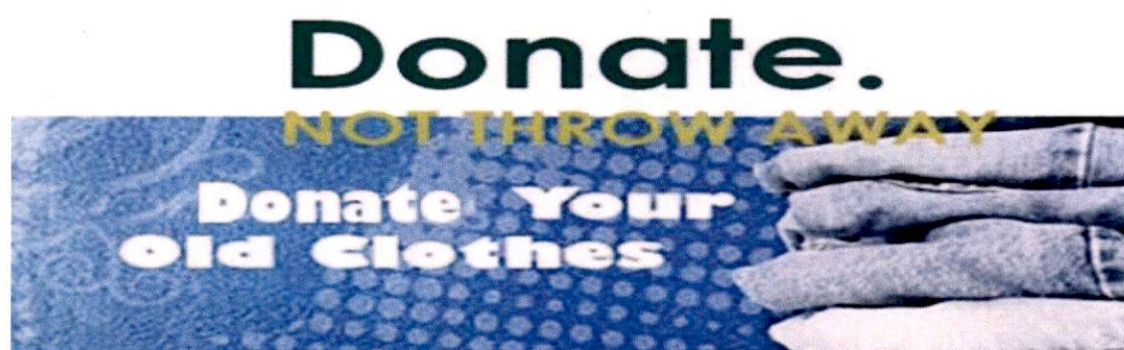

ESSAY WRITING COMPETITION ON SOCIAL ISSUES

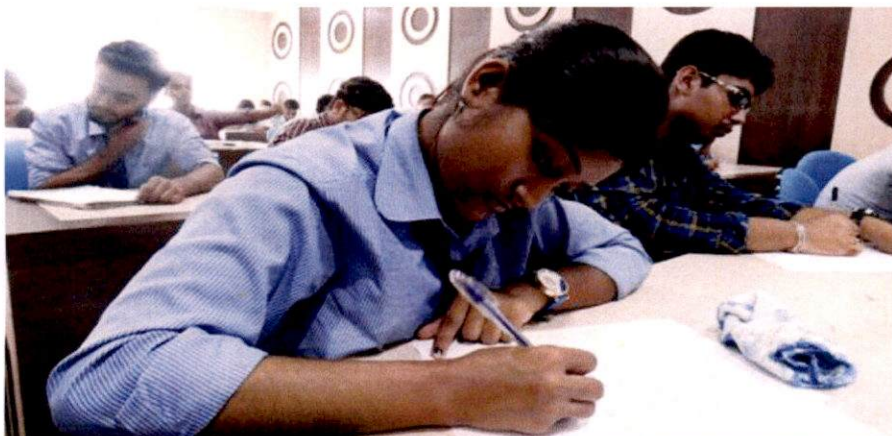

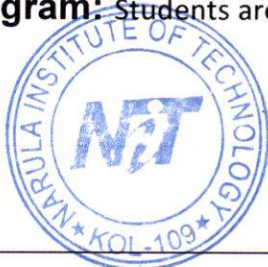


Essay Writing competition by students 21th august,2015

Number of Participant: 157

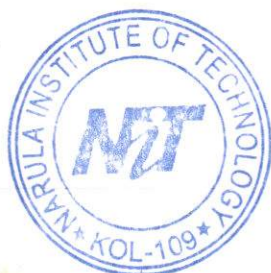
Description of the Program:

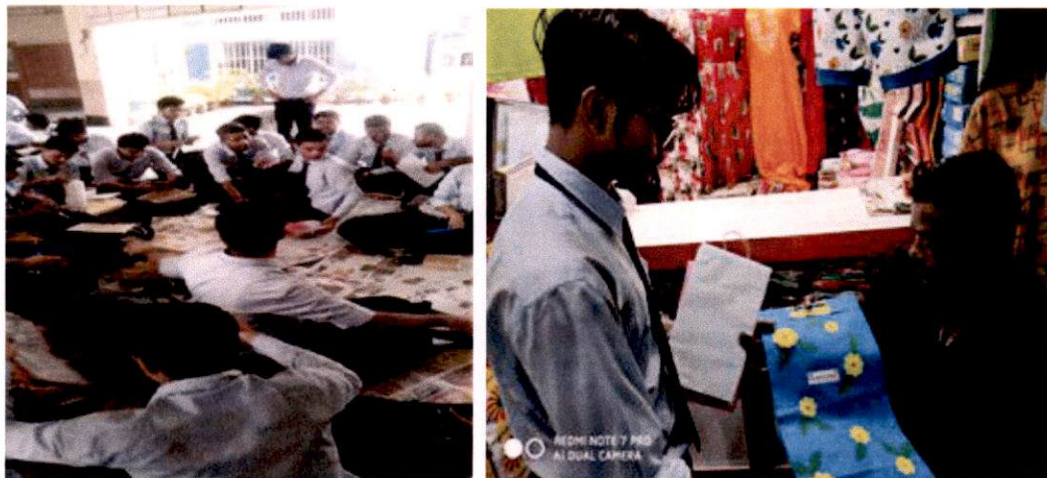
