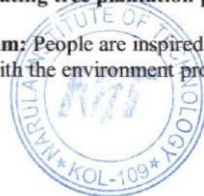

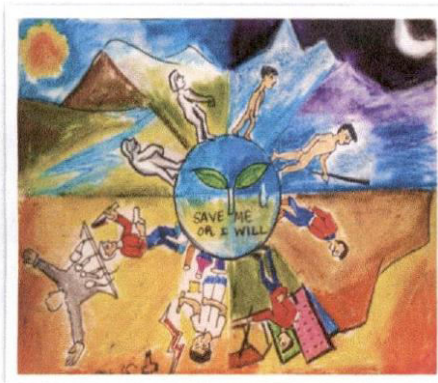

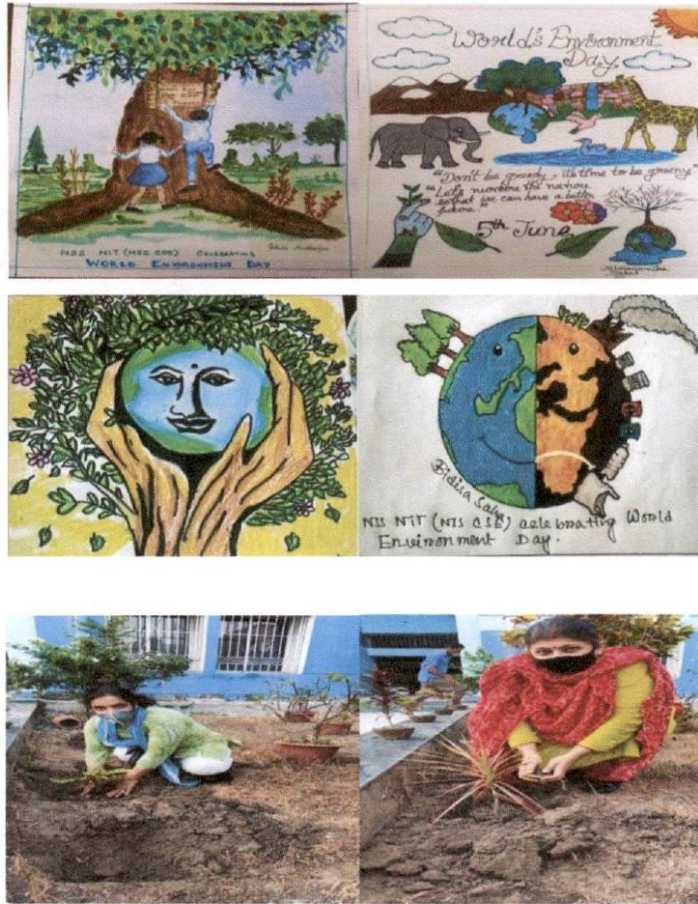

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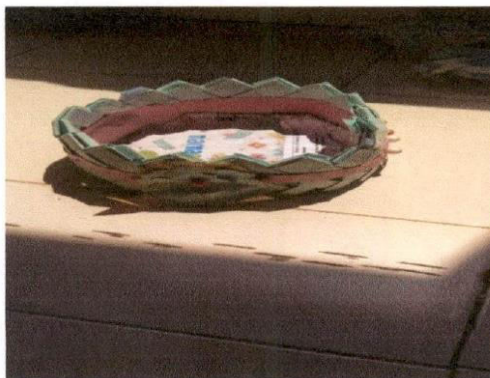

Description of the Program: On 3rd October 2018, the institute has organized a college-wide event on Waste Management techniques. 59 students from all departments and almost all years were involved. The aim of the event was a response to the Swachh Bharat Abhiyaan that is mandated all over India. The environment we live in, must be clean and hygienic, however modern consumerist human societies generate a lot of waste products and most of it is non-biodegradable. This creates a problem since these wastes are either burnt, which produces massive air pollution, or they become part of the landfill, which poisons both the soil and the ground water in long run. Expert lecture was organized by the college on this issue where the students were explained how production of massive amount of waste is ruining the balance of the ecology and how to effectively manage the waste. The principles of “Zero-waste living” were introduced to the participants. Afterwards, a small exhibition was organized where students displayed art and crafts made with waste material. 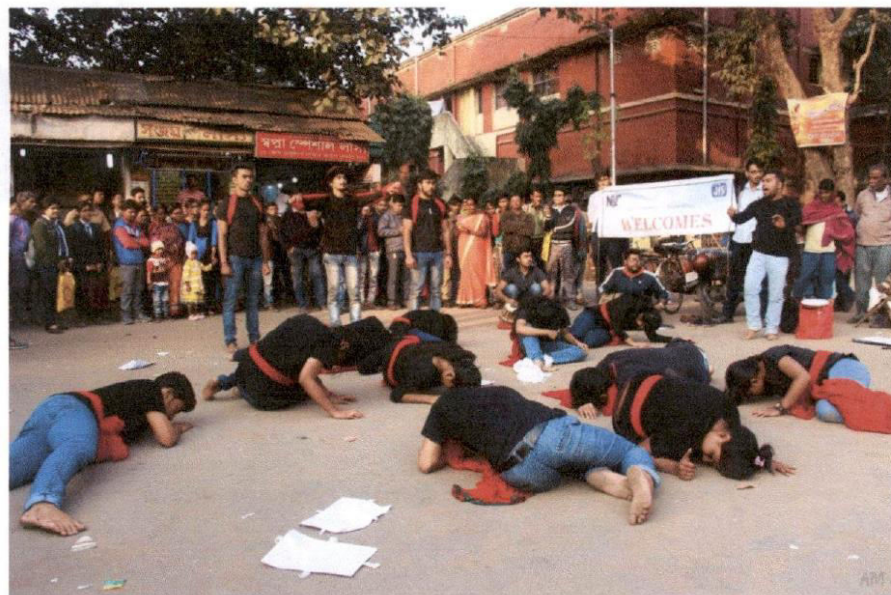

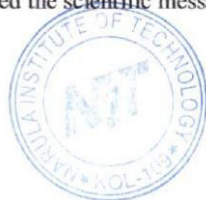
Description of the Program:

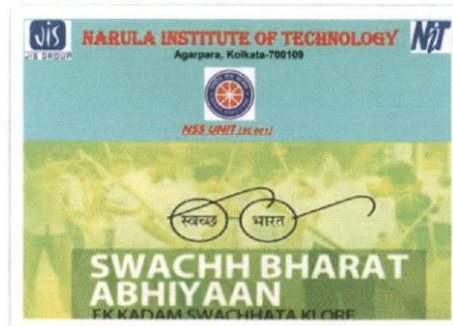

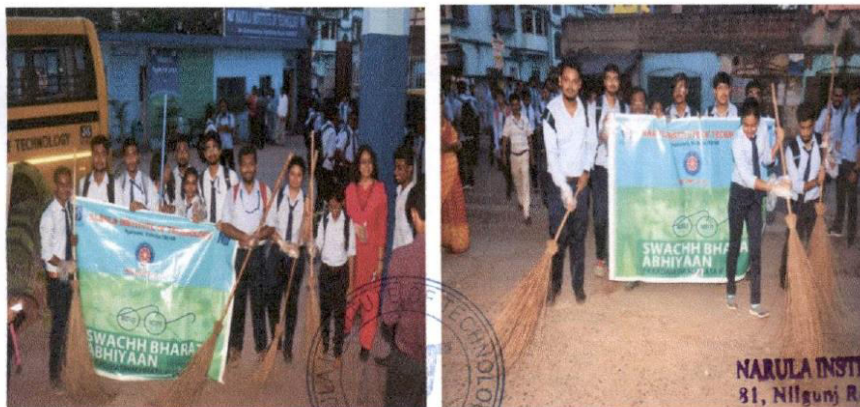

Description of the Program:

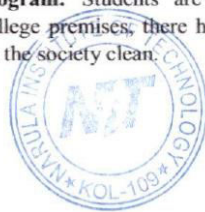
