NATIONAL SOCIAL SERVICE (NSS)

The National Service Scheme (NSS) was officially started in the year 1969, to establish a meaningful linkage between the campus and the community. The vision is to build the youth with the mind and spirit to serve the society and work for the uplift of our country as a movement.

- Social services are a range of public services provided by any national or regional government organization for its residents, including such things as health care, public housing, social care and social security.
- According to Web definition, it is an organized activity to improve the condition of disadvantaged people in society.
- According to Merriam Webster, „Social service is an activity designated to promote social well-being specifically organized Philanthropic assistance to disadvantaged“.

After independence the University Grants Commission, headed by S. Radhakrishnan, recommended the introduction of voluntary national service in academic institutions. This idea was again considered by the Central Advisory Board of Education (CABE) at its meeting in January, 1950. Mahatma Gandhi, the Father of the Nation, had recognised that the country could not progress in a desired direction until the student youth were motivated to work for the upliftment of the villages/community. For Gandhiji, the villages, where majority of the population living, represent the country. Therefore, for the national reconstruction and national resurgence it was deemed fit that the students and teachers should be properly sensitised and utilised for strengthening the Indian society as a whole with particular emphasis on rural community. Therefore, student youth,

teachers and the community are considered as the three basic components of the National Service Scheme. After examining the idea and the experiences of other countries in this field, the board recommended that students and teachers should devote time to voluntary manual work. In 1958 Jawaharlal Nehru, in a letter to the chief ministers, considered the idea of social service as a prerequisite for graduation. It was directed the Ministry of Education to formulate a suitable scheme for the introduction of national service into academic institutions. The Education Commission (headed by D.S. Kothari from 1964–1966) recommended that students at every stage of education should be associated with some form of social service. In a government statement of national policy on education, it was stated that work experience and national service should be an integral part of education. The National Service Scheme has been functioning with the motto “NOT ME BUT YOU” in view of making the youth inspired in service of the people and hence NSS Aims Education through Community Service through Education.

Social services are a range of public services provided by any national or regional government organization for its residents, including such things as health care, public housing, social care and social security. According to Web definition, it is an organized activity to improve the condition of disadvantaged people in society. We stay true to our mission by realigning our wide-ranging roles with five new strategic thrusts to better meet tomorrow's social needs. Expanding on our responsibilities as a membership body, we strive to be the voice of the sector and an advocate for underserved needs. 

Objective of the Event: To aware the people against child labour



Description of the program:



This day also helps in educating these kids' parents that employing a child is morally and illegally wrong. ***This year the theme of this special day is "Act now: End Child Labour".***






The event spanned over three days where the students and faculty members participated enthusiastically for wellness and meditation sessions, as well as an active yoga session, conducted by Ms. Goyal



Objective of the Event: To restore the greenery in the world





"Tobacco Companies Kill Their Best Customers and Once You Start; It's Hard to Stop..."

All India institute of medical and Science(IIMs) studied the smoking behavior of more than 4500 children, ages 11 to 14 years, in Delhi's 30 schools; nearly 8.5% children experimented with smoking. The study noted that the mean age for intervention is 12 years.
